Sharing the burdens, carrying the loads, and sharing in the harvest. A time to reflect on how best to help those serving overseas.

Your world mission focus country is:

Preparation

Find out as much as you can about the history of the country you are praying for. Read the latest newsletter or blog from the missionaries.

Ask the group what they know about the country you are focusing on and the missionaries serving there.

Share about the country and what prayers are needed for them for the year ahead.



Use these verses to guide your thoughts on mission and discuss.

Matthew 9.37-38

'Then he said to his disciples, the harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.'

1. What is the link between workers and the harvest?

John 17:18

'As you sent me into the world, I also send them into the world.'

- 2. In what ways was Jesus sent?
- 3. How can our lives reflect that?

4. Who is Jesus calling you to?

Mission calling

Imagine you were leaving your family and friends and setting off to foreign lands to spread the good news of Jesus, how would you like your family and friends to support you? Make a list.

5. What you could do from this list, for your World Mission week.

Missionaries going to a foreign place often experience different levels of transitional adjustments.

- 6. Have any of you ever moved to a completely new area or changed countries?
- 7. Perhaps you can share with the group some of your adjustment experiences. Share with the group the advantages or challenges in your new area.
- 8. Think for a moment how these circumstances may be affecting the missionaries you are praying for and include them in your prayer time.

Most long-term missionaries rely on on-going monetary gift funds, prayer support and encouraging visits/communications from their church, families, friends and mission partners. All of these are of equal importance.

9. As a community or individuals within your community discuss what areas of support you feel most called?

10. How is this quote helpful and how does it relate to Romans 10?

Romans 10: 14-15

'How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher? How will they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, how beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news of good things!'
